## Baltimore Center Stage Announces Cast and Artistic Team for *Indecent*

**Baltimore, MD February 19, 2019----** Baltimore Center Stage is pleased to announce the cast and artistic team for *Indecent*. Recently nominated for seven 2019 Helen Hayes Awards, *Indecent*, masterfully penned by Pulitzer-winning playwright Paula Vogel, examines: What is the cost when we sacrifice truth for success? Can radical love be pious, or merely provocative? Does every religion sell God for a price?

"We could not be more thrilled to showcase this play and once again showcase a Paula Vogel work here at Baltimore Center Stage," said Baltimore Center Stage Executive Director Michael Ross. Vogel's previous work at Baltimore Center Stage include *The Baltimore Waltz* in 1992 and *A Civil War Christmas* in 2013. *Incecent* is produced in association with Arena Stage and The Kansas City Repertory.

Directed by Eric Rosen and inspired by the 1923 Broadway debut of Sholem Asch's Yiddish drama *God of Vengeance* and the controversy swirling around its themes and censorship, *Indecent* explores topics once again timely, such as immigration, anti-Semitism and the story of the courageous artists who risked not only their careers, but their lives in bringing the play to the stage. Infused with traditional Yiddish folk music of the early 20<sup>th</sup> century, *Indecent* is the kind of story that demonstrates the power theater can have on our lives.
