#### **Honor Native Land**

Responding to a call from our Indigenous colleagues, collaborators, and neighbors, Baltimore Center Stage is working toward building meaningful and accountable relationships with the land we occupy. As a first step on this path, you'll see a land acknowledgement in each of our programs. Acknowledgement is itself a small gesture, and we look forward to continuing our efforts toward decolonization in a meaningful way. Baltimore Center Stage acknowledges that the land beneath us, this place, this community, owes its vitality to generations who have come before. Some were brought forcibly to this land, some came here in search of ownership or simply a better life, and some have lived and stewarded this land for countless generations. Their relations are numerous throughout Turtle Island, and they continue to grow. We pay respects to their elders: past, present, and future. Please take a moment to consider the many legacies of violence, displacement, migration, and settlement that bring us together here today. And please join us in uncovering such truths at any and all public events.

Additionally, in the spirit of reconciliation, you can honor the Indigenous peoples of this land by donating to Native American Lifelines, donating to or visiting the Baltimore American Indian Center & Heritage Museum, and supporting local Indigenous artists. These are only a few suggestions of the many ways we can move towards reconciliation.

actor of ten years. Mecca uses her anger and passion to speak on the 'soft' and 'pink' of Black culture. Her writing fearlessly ventures and unveils Black American shadows from generational trauma. She centers the pain, joys, and beauty of Blackness through the lens of womanhood and queer experiences. As a Teaching Artist, they've used their work to connect teachers and students to create emotionally intelligent responses in an academic space. Mecca has molded poetry for marketing and commercials as a Visit Baltimore Ambassador and or the National Education Association. Through her success, she has been performing at universities, embassies, and theaters, showing audiences how poetry can peek into the spirit and turn healing into ritual. Their debut book, The Things I've Unlearned, is an example of that process. In 2024, she is proud to have opened for Saul Williams, created her fundraiser Pass the Mic that raises money for local black organizations. She is a 2024 Map Fund fellow producing her one-woman show Da Art of Letting go.

In 2024 she was appointed by Governor Wes Moore as the Poet Laureate of Maryland, making her the youngest Poet Laureate in Maryland's history and the only spoken word artist to ever hold this position. She received her B.A. in Communication and Culture from Howard University and her MFA in Creative Writing & Publishing Design from the University of Baltimore. During her slam career she has won the 2016 and 2021 National Poetry Slam, the 2017 and 2019 Southern Fried Regional Slam, and the 2019 Rustbelt Regional Slam. In 2021 she became the Women of the World Poetry Slam Champion making her the number one ranked woman slam poet in the world.

They serve as Curator of Black American Religion and Spirituality for The African American Folklorist Magazine.
